

Precision Implementation Approach™ for Evidence-Based Perinatal Mental Healthcare

Workshop Description

This hands-on pre-conference workshop will guide participants through the most challenging step of any practice improvement – that of implementing a change. Perinatal mental healthcare occurs across complex health systems in which translating research to provide evidence-based care is complex. This application oriented workshop will use interactive learning to develop skills, for hands-on use of tools and resources to create success. Learn to use *The Iowa Model Revised: Evidence-Based Practice to Promote Excellence in Health Care* as your map for navigating the pot holes (places you get stuck), hazards (things you don't see coming) and roadblocks (barriers) in making a change using the EBP process. Design EBP evaluation for local data to drive a Precision Implementation Approach™. Apply *Diffusion of Innovations Theory* to create a four-phased implementation plan for a sustainable EBP change that improves care for mothers and infants in your practice setting. Course content is intended for anyone interested in making a change in practice and would benefit psychiatrists, psychologists, other practitioners, researchers, doctoral students and faculty. Participants will receive a copy of *EBP in Action: Strategies, Tools and Tips* as part of the workshop attendance. Implementation resources will be provided both during and following the pre-conference.

Objectives:

- Describe how to apply the Iowa Model of EBP to improve perinatal mental health
- Develop an implementation plan using strategies for adoption and sustainability of evidence-based practice changes that improve clinical and operational outcomes
- Describe considerations for optimizing the organizational infrastructure to promote delivery of evidence-based care for mothers and infants
- Use an evidence-based practice book with strategies, tools, and resources to promote effective implementation
