

# Systematic Literature Searching

## **Workshop Description**

This session will provide a framework for developing a systematic search for reviews or projects that demand strong search methodology. The first half of the session will be focus on the following topics: standards to consider, establishing a plan, assembling a team, registering a protocol, developing a research question, determining where to search, identifying search terms, reporting search strategies, and managing references. During the second half, database searching will be focus, incorporating active learning (please bring a device!) There will be time for guided practice with conducting both subject and keyword searching in key databases for clinical practice, such as PubMed, PsycINFO, CINAHL, Cochrane Library, and Embase.
